Primary PE and Sport Funding: 2019/2020

What is the PE and Sport Premium?

The Government provides schools in England, Scotland and Wales with additional funding to help them develop and enrich their sports provision across the school. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and provides money directly to primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- ❖ Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- ❖ New or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- ❖ Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- ❖ Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- ❖ Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- ❖ Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- ❖ Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.
