### Primary PE and Sport Funding: 2020/2021

#### What is the PE and Sport Premium?

The Government provides schools in England, Scotland and Wales with additional funding to help them develop and enrich their sports provision across the school. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- ❖ Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- ❖ New or additional sport clubs
- ❖ Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- ❖ Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- ❖ Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- ❖ Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- ❖ Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.

At Our Lady of Victories we have a Physical Education development plan in order to continue to improve provision and raise the achievement of all pupils in PE and Sport.

Our key objectives include:

- ❖ To improve the quality of PE delivered in lessons
- ❖ To increase the involvement and participation in the local competitive opportunities e.g. RBKC's School Games programme (inter-school festivals and leagues) and evidence the impact on pupils
- ❖ To raise the profile of sports and encourage all children to participate in sports
- ❖ Continue to improve the quality of the space provided for sports activities.
- ❖ Ensure that PE is adequately resourced

#### School closures due to COVID 19 March 2020

School closed in March 2020 due to the lockdown. Our PE changed to remote learning. PE videos were posted each morning on our Virtual Learning Platform for children to participate in. Among others, we primarily used the Joe Wicks PE lessons.

Our Lady of Victories reopened in September 2020. Many of our initiatives cannot take place due to Covid restrictions. Our after school extra curricular sports are not taking place this term due to COVID restrictions. However, we remain focussed on providing high quality PE lessons during this time.
